## HOW WE ARE WORKING ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS

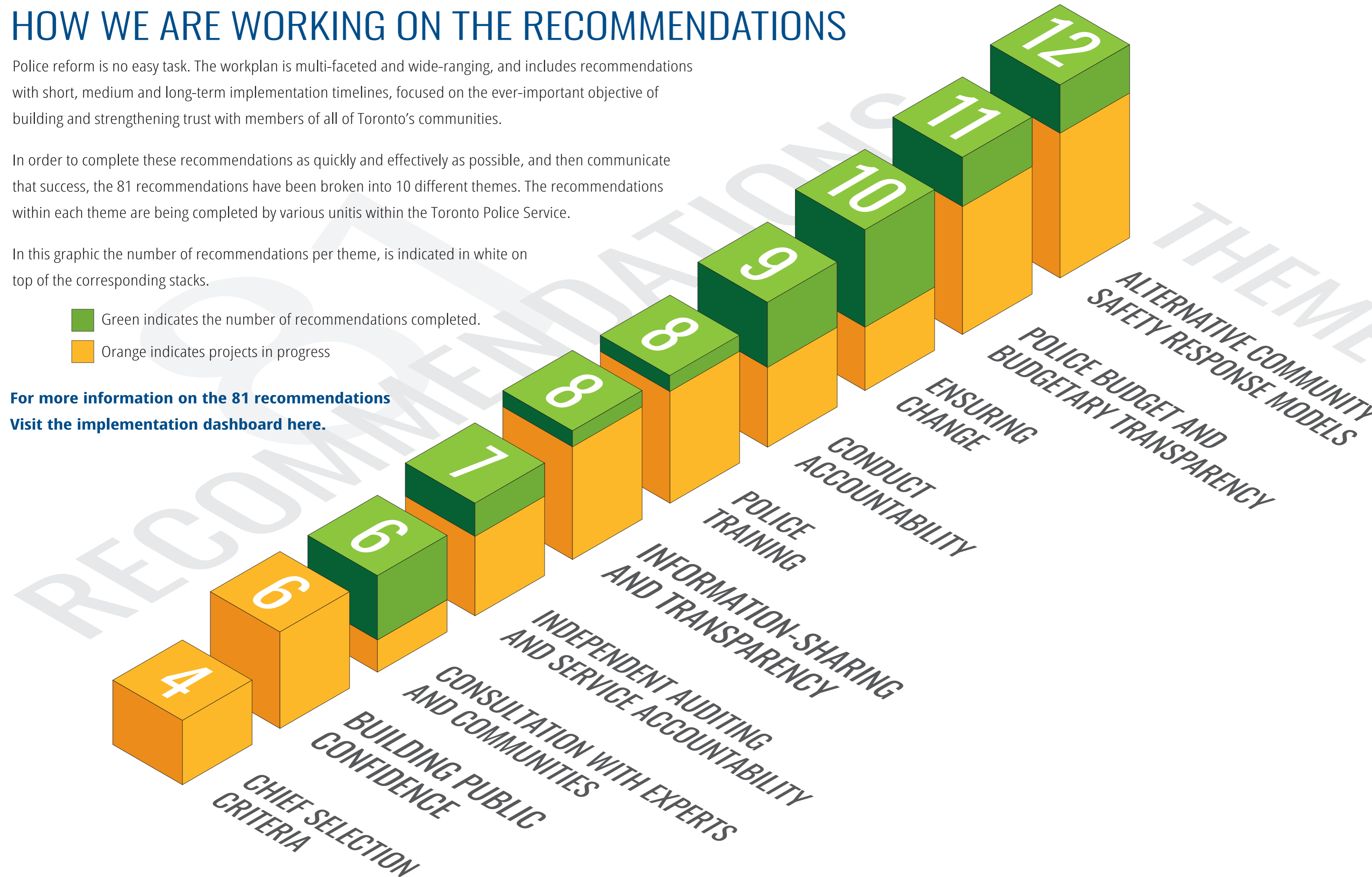
Police reform is no easy task. The workplan is multi-faceted and wide-ranging, and includes recommendations with short, medium and long-term implementation timelines, focused on the ever-important objective of building and strengthening trust with members of all of Toronto's communities.

In order to complete these recommendations as quickly and effectively as possible, and then communicate that success, the 81 recommendations have been broken into 10 different themes. The recommendations within each theme are being completed by various units within the Toronto Police Service.

In this graphic the number of recommendations per theme, is indicated in white on top of the corresponding stacks.

- Green indicates the number of recommendations completed.
- Orange indicates projects in progress.

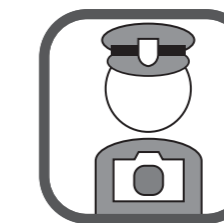

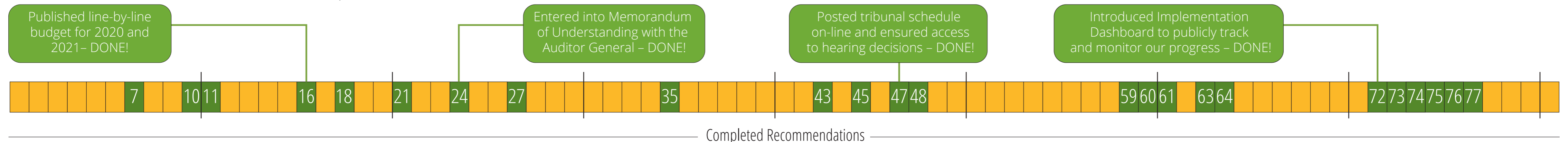
### ADDITIONAL REFORM INITIATIVES:



**Body Worn Camera Initiative**  
The introduction of Body-Worn Cameras (BWCs), the roll-out for which is continuing across the Service. The province's Information and Privacy Commissioner (IPC) recently wrote a letter in which she comments favourably on the roll out, noting that she has "decided to draw from this positive experience to develop general BWC guidance for police services across Ontario."



**Reform of Strip Search Procedures**  
Reforming the Service's Strip Search procedures to ensure all strip searches are justified and monitored appropriately. The province's Office of the Independent Police Review Director (OIRPD) recently wrote a letter to the province in which he recommended that all police services in Ontario refer to the new TPS procedure as a "best in class" model.
