BODY-WORN CAMERAS POLICY - PUBLIC CONSULTATION

The body-worn camera policy has been finalized. This consultation period is now closed.

BACKGROUND

At its meeting of August 18, 2020, the Toronto Police Services Board approved the deployment of body-worn cameras (BWCs) to front-line officers. BWCs are being deployed to Service Members as one of the ways to improve accountability, address systemic racism, and also improve the police services delivered by the Service Members to the community.

BWCs also pose novel risks and challenges that must be addressed. The world has demonstrated that the governance of BWCs is critical to ensure accountability, and that where such governance is lacking, it can lead to officer misconduct.

Therefore, in advance of the full deployment of BWCs, the Board is seeking public input on the governance of BWCs, to ensure that this tool is implemented in a way that is transparent to the public. If approved by the Board, this Policy will provide the framework for the BWC Procedures – which will govern officers and the entire
