It is the policy of the Toronto Police Services Board that:

- 1. The Chief of Police will establish procedures and processes in respect of police response to persons who are emotionally disturbed or have a mental illness or a developmental disability; and
- 2. The Chief of Police will work, where possible, with appropriate community members and agencies, health care providers, government agencies, municipal officials, other criminal justice agencies and the local Crown to address service issues relating to persons who are emotionally disturbed or who have a mental illness or a developmental disability.
